

7.1 Institutional Values and Social Responsibilities

7.1.1 Initiatives for the Promotion of Gender Equity during the Last Three Years

2. NSS Activities for Gender Sensitization:

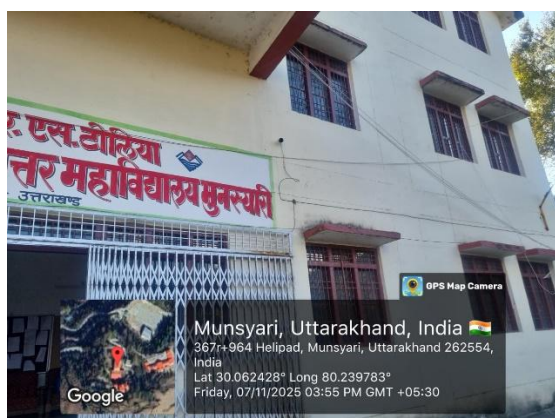

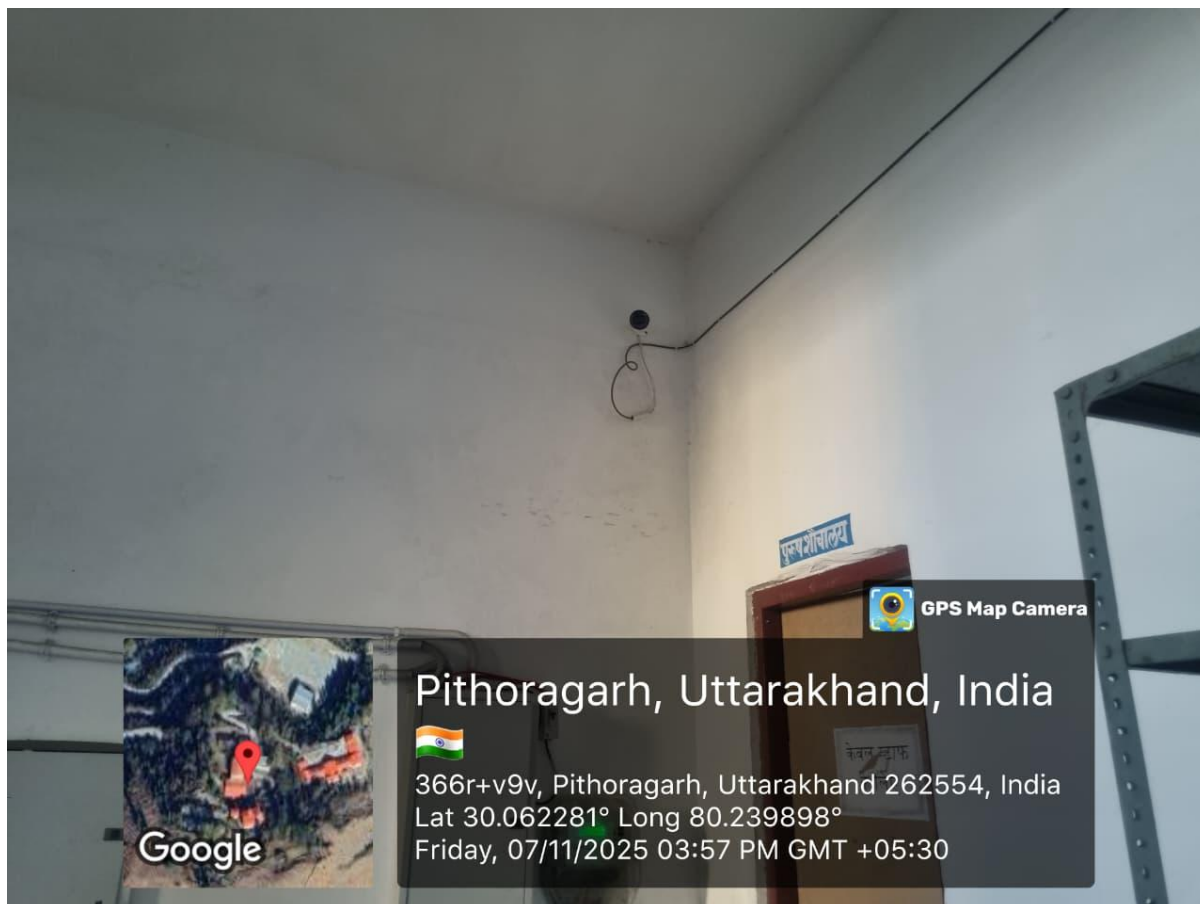
3. Counseling and Mentor Support:

4. Safety and Security Measures:

- CCTV cameras are installed at important locations in the campus for safety monitoring.

- Security personnel are deployed during college hours.
- Anti-Ragging Committee and Grievance Redressal Committee ensure a safe and fear-free atmosphere.
- The college regularly communicates with parents in case of irregular attendance or concerns regarding student safety.

5. Gender Equity through Curriculum and Co-Curricular Activities:

Topics on gender equality, human rights, and social responsibility are integrated into classroom discussions, especially within Humanities and Social Science courses. Students are encouraged to participate in debates, poster-making competitions, and essay contests on gender-related themes.



6. Health and Hygiene Facilities for Girl Students:

- Separate restrooms for girls are available on campus.
- Sanitary napkin vending machines have been installed to maintain hygiene and comfort.

8. Counseling and Life Skills Sessions:

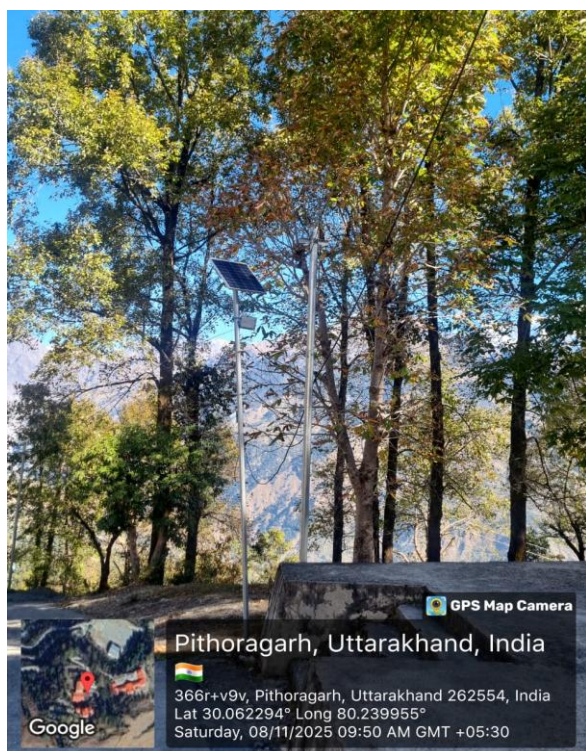
Sessions on personal safety, self-defense, communication skills, and confidence building are periodically conducted to empower girl students and enhance their overall development

7.1.2 Alternate Sources of Energy and Energy Conservation Measures

L. Dr. R. S. Tolia Government P.G. College, Munsiyari, recognizes the importance of conserving natural resources and promoting sustainable energy practices. The institution has adopted several measures to reduce its carbon footprint and ensure efficient utilization of energy resources.

1. Solar Energy

The college campus is equipped with **solar panels** that harness renewable energy to meet a part of its electricity requirements. This initiative not only reduces dependency on conventional power sources but also promotes awareness among students about the use of clean and sustainable energy. The generated solar power supports lighting and other basic electrical needs of the institution, especially during power outages, which are common in hilly areas.

2. Use of LED Bulbs and Power-Efficient Equipment

The institution has replaced traditional lighting systems with **LED bulbs and tube lights** across classrooms, laboratories, corridors, and offices. This transition has significantly reduced energy consumption and maintenance costs. Additionally, **power-efficient electrical appliances** such as refrigerators, fans, and computer systems are used in the campus to ensure optimal energy utilization.

3. Awareness on Energy Conservation

The NSS unit of the college organizes awareness campaigns, poster competitions, and lectures on environmental protection and energy conservation. Students are sensitized about the importance of switching off lights and fans when not in use, minimizing wastage of electricity, and adopting eco-friendly habits both on and off campus.

4. Environmental Responsibility

The college emphasizes eco-friendly practices as part of its institutional culture. Plantation drives, clean energy awareness programs, and participation in government-led sustainability initiatives contribute to the college's mission of maintaining a green and energy-conscious campus.

7.1.3 Degradable and Non-Degradable Waste Management

L. Dr. R. S. Tolia Government P.G. College, Munsiyari, is committed to maintaining a clean and eco-friendly campus in harmony with the surrounding Himalayan environment. The institution adopts the **3R principle – Reduce, Reuse, and Recycle** – to ensure responsible waste management. Various initiatives and awareness programmes are undertaken to minimize waste generation and promote environmental consciousness among students and staff.



1. Solid Waste Management

- The college maintains **dustbins in all departments, classrooms, and open areas** to ensure proper segregation of biodegradable and non-biodegradable waste.
- **Biodegradable waste** such as leaf litter and food residues is collected separately and used for composting in a small **vermicompost unit** on campus. The compost produced is used in the college garden.
- **Non-biodegradable waste** like plastics and paper are periodically collected and handed over to the **local municipal body** for proper disposal.
- Regular **cleanliness drives** under the *Swachh Bharat Abhiyan* and *NSS* are organized to maintain hygiene and spread awareness about solid waste management.

2. Liquid Waste Management

- The college ensures that waste water from laboratories and washrooms is drained through a proper pipeline system connected to the local drainage network.
- Staff and students are sensitized to avoid wastage of water and ensure taps are closed properly after use.

- The institution encourages water conservation practices and regular maintenance of water supply systems to prevent leakage and wastage.

3. E-Waste Management

- Old and unusable electronic items such as computers, printers, and batteries are identified, recorded, and **disposed of responsibly** through authorized vendors or in coordination with government-approved recycling agencies.
- Efforts are made to **reuse functional parts** of electronic items where possible to minimize e-waste generation.

4. Plastic Waste Management

- The campus observes a “**Plastic-Free Campus**” initiative, discouraging the use of single-use plastics.
- NSS volunteers conduct awareness campaigns and rallies in nearby villages and markets to educate people about the harmful effects of plastic pollution.
- Students and staff are encouraged to use cloth or jute bags and reusable containers.

5. Paper Waste Management

- The college practices **paper minimization** by promoting digital submission of assignments, notices, and reports whenever feasible.
- One-sided used papers are reused for rough work and internal purposes.

7.1.4 Water Conservation Facilities

Recognizing the importance of water conservation, the institution has undertaken several measures to ensure judicious use, conservation, and sustainable management of water resources on campus.

1. Rainwater Harvesting

- The collected water helps in recharging the groundwater level and is used for gardening and cleaning purposes.
- Awareness programs have been conducted to sensitize students about the significance of rainwater harvesting, especially in hilly terrains.

2. Waste Water Recycling and Reuse

- Water from hand-washing areas and laboratories is **collected and reused** for plantation and horticultural purposes wherever possible.
- The institution promotes the **reuse of greywater** within the campus to minimize wastage.

3. Water-Saving Mechanisms

- The college has installed **taps with controlled flow** to reduce unnecessary water wastage.
- Regular monitoring and maintenance of pipelines and tanks are carried out to prevent leakage and ensure efficient water usage.
- Students and staff are made aware of the need to **turn off taps properly** and report leakages immediately.

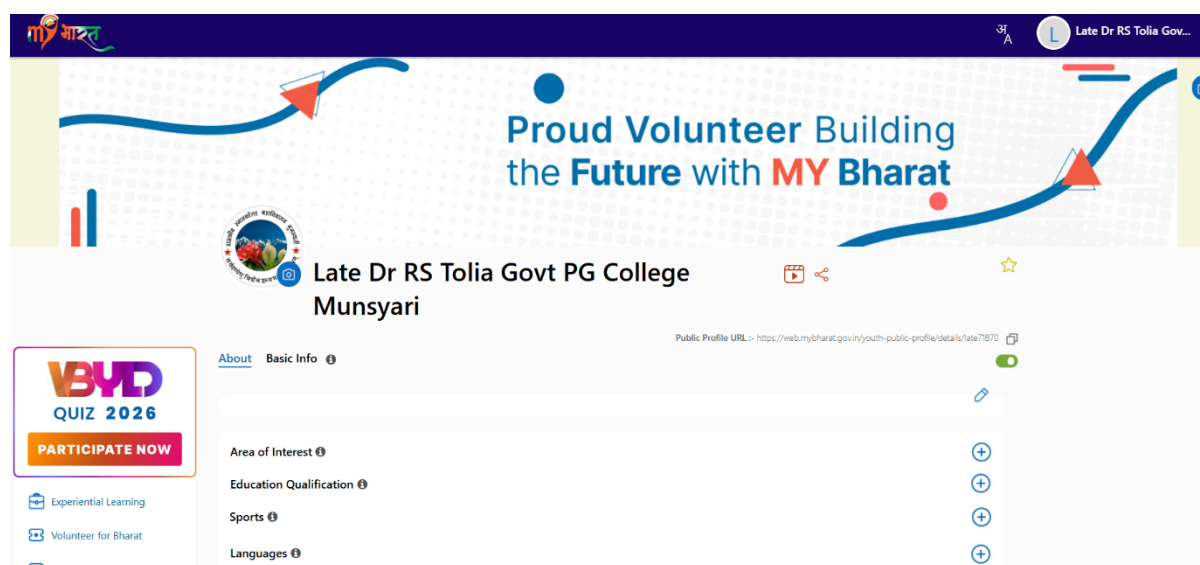
4. Maintenance of Water Bodies and Distribution System

The college strives to create a **green, sustainable, and eco-conscious campus** through continuous environmental initiatives and student participation.

1. Restricted Entry of Automobiles

- The college promotes a **vehicle-restricted zone** within the campus premises.
- Entry of automobiles is limited to essential administrative or emergency purposes only.
- Students and staff are encouraged to park vehicles outside the main gate to minimize pollution and noise levels within the campus area.

2. Use of Bicycles and Pedestrian-Friendly Pathways

- As the college is located in a hilly region, most students and faculty prefer to **walk to the campus**, promoting both health and sustainability.

3. During institutional programmes and examinations, **special arrangements are made** as needed to support Divyangjan candidates.

2. Divyangjan-Friendly Washrooms

1. The college has **separate, accessible washrooms** designed for use by differently-abled students and staff members.
2. These washrooms are regularly cleaned and maintained to ensure hygiene and convenience.

3. Signage and Display Boards

- The campus includes **directional and room signage** with clear, visible lettering to help all students easily locate departments, offices, and facilities.
